Haman Plots Against the Jews

- After these things King Ahasuerus promoted **Haman** the Agagite, and advanced him and set his throne above all the officials who were with **Haman**. And all the king's servants who were at the king's gate bowed down and paid homage to **Haman**, for the king had so commanded concerning **Haman**.
- But **Mordecai** did not bow down or pay homage. Then the king's servants who were at the king's gate said to **Mordecai**, "Why do you transgress the king's command?"
- And when they spoke to **Mordecai** day after day and **Mordecai** would not listen to them, they told **Haman**, in order to see whether **Mordecai's** words would stand, for **Mordecai** had told them that he was a Jew.
- And when **Haman** saw that **Mordecai** did not bow down or pay homage to him, **Haman** was filled with fury. But **Haman** disdained to lay hands on **Mordecai** alone. So, as they had made known to him the people of **Mordecai**, **Haman** sought to destroy all the Jews, the people of **Mordecai**, throughout the whole kingdom of Ahasuerus.
- Then **Haman** said to King Ahasuerus, "There is a certain people scattered abroad and dispersed among the peoples in all the provinces of your kingdom. Their laws are different from those of every other people, and they do not keep the king's laws, so that it is not to the king's profit to tolerate them.
- If it please the king, let it be decreed that they be destroyed, and I will pay 10,000 talents of silver into the hands of those who have charge of the king's business, that they may put it into the king's treasuries."
- So the king took his signet ring from his hand and gave it to **Haman**, the enemy of the Jews. And the king said to **Haman**, "The money is given to you, the people also, to do with them as it seems good to you." **Haman** sent couriers to all the king's provinces with instruction to destroy, to kill, and to annihilate all Jews, young and old, women and children, in one day, the thirteenth day of the twelfth month, and to plunder their goods.
- When **Mordecai** learned all that had been done, **Mordecai** tore his clothes and put on sackcloth and ashes, and **Mordecai** went out into the midst of the city,

and he cried out with a loud and bitter cry. **Mordecai** went up to the entrance of the king's gate, for no one was allowed to enter the king's gate clothed in sackcloth.

And in every province, wherever the **Haman's** command and **Haman's** decree reached, there was great mourning among the Jews, the people of **Mordecai**, with fasting and weeping and lamenting, and many of them lay in sackcloth and ashes.


