May 26-29: No access to MPR or office bathroom - must use MPR bathroom




My Dear Friends:

for Humanity[®] beef dinner fundraiser in March with all proceeds to benefit Habitat. That dinner raised more than \$11,000!! Thanks to all

from St. Philip's who supported the dinner! It costs a minimum of \$65,000 to build a Habitat house and each year the UCC churches of St. Louis try to completely fund the construction costs of one house -- that \$11,000 will be added to all of the contributions from congregations like St. Philip's for our 2023 donation.

The 2023 work schedule has been set and St. Philip's will supply the full volunteer crew (10 people) for a work day in October. It has been several years since we have had the manpower to supply even a half-crew, much less a full crew, so this is exciting! Andrea Tukin will be coordinating to fill that crew with volunteers from the Young(er) Adult Social/Service group.

Outreach Ministry

St. Philip's Lenten Project benefiting Isaiah 58 Ministries was a huge success! We collected 152 food items with a nice variety including many protein sources: tuna,

canned hams, chicken, salmon and the reportedly much-loved sardines (65 cans!). We also collected 15 personal care item, 15 large bags of clothing and \$725 cash from the Outreach miscellaneous fund, Pastor's discretionary fund, and member contributions.

On the day after Palm Sunday, Donna and Carl Philips and Barbara Barnes made a delivery to Isaiah 58 Ministries on South Grand, and enjoyed a tour of the facilities with Reverend Meredith Jackson, who presented a Mission Moment early in



lent. We were very impressed with what we saw, a well stocked small "grocery store" where recipients can select food items of their choice, and a clean well-organized clothing room where recipients can "shop" for clothing.



We should be very proud of the St Louis Association for sponsoring this well run and highly needed resource in the South City neighborhood, and we should be proud and happy that we were able to make an impactful contribution.
